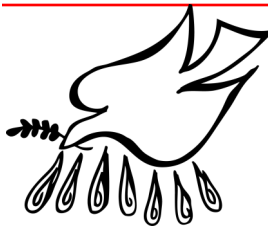

BLESSED MOTHER TERESA OF CALCUTTA
(1910 – 1997)



“We are called upon not to be successful, but to be faithful.”

Born to Albanian parents in what is now Skopje, Macedonia, Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhiu was the youngest of three children who survived. The family for a time lived comfortably and her father’s construction business prospered. Life changed overnight following her father’s unexpected death.

During Agnes’ years in public school she participated in Catholic sodality and showed a great interest in foreign missions. She entered the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin when she was 18. In 1928 she said goodbye to her mother for the last time and made her way to a new land and a new life. In 1929 she was sent to the Loreto novitiate in Darjeeling, India. While there she chose the name Teresa and prepared for a life of service. She was assigned to a high school for girls in Calcutta, where she taught history and geography to the daughters of the wealthy. Sister Teresa could not escape the poverty, suffering, the overwhelming numbers of destitute people around her. Some people did not have enough food to eat, others were sick and had no one to care for them.

In 1946, while Sister Teresa was traveling to Darjeeling by train to make a retreat she heard what she later described as “a call within a call. The message was clear, she was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them.” She also heard the call to give up her life with the Sisters of Loreto and to “follow Christ into the slums to serve him among the poorest of the poor.”

After receiving permission to leave Loreto, establish a new religious community and take on her new work, she took a nursing course for several months. She returned to Calcutta, where she lived in the slums and opened a school for poor children. Dressed in a white sari and sandals, which was the ordinary dress of an Indian woman, she began to get to know her neighbors, especially the poor and sick and finding out their needs through visits.

This new work was exhausting but she was not alone for long. Volunteers who came to join her in the work, some of them were her former students became the core of the Missionaries of Charity. It was then that Sister Teresa became Mother Teresa, the founder of the new order.

For the next four decades Mother Teresa worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor. In 1979 she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. On September 5, 1997, God called her home but she still inspires us today. Mother Teresa was beatified October 19, 2003 by Pope John Paul II. On September 4, 2016 Pope Francis will canonize Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta and she will then be St. Teresa of Calcutta.
