FUNERALS DURING RESTORATION The question was asked where are funerals to be held? There are three possibilities:

1. Mass can be celebrated in the funeral home. Bishop Campbell has given permission for this to happen. I will still inform the Diocese before a funeral takes place at an area funeral home.
2. Mass can be celebrated in the Church Hall. We can't use incense due to the fire/smoke alarms.
3. Mass could be celebrated in an area Catholic Church. I specifically asked the Bishop about using one of the Protestant Churches for funerals. I was reminded that if we celebrate Mass on their altar, we consecrate it! So, absolutely NOT. The family must make the arrangements with a Catholic Church in Lancaster or Chillicothe with the funeral home, the church, Fr. Ted and Patty Immell.

It is never an easy task to pack all that we need to have a Mass in another location...Funeral pall, vestments, wine and hosts, Liturgical books, and whatever the host Church will require of us. It isn't as easy as just showing up and doing it! Some Churches require using their servers, organist, choir, and other guidelines they might have regarding funerals.

There is no possibility of having a bereavement meal in our Hall during this time.

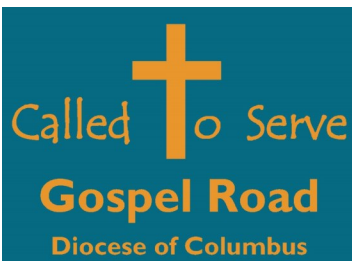
