DID YOU KNOW?

Do you know the Liturgical colors and what they symbolize? Liturgical colors symbolize the meaning of Church seasons. You can observe these colors on a Liturgical calendar, on vestments worn by priests at Mass, and in church décor.

WHITE: Is the color of joy and victory. It reminds us of Baptism and of the Resurrection.

RED: Is the color of fire and blood. We find it used Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Pentecost, and martyrs' feast days.

GREEN: symbolizes life and hope.

VIOLET: Denotes humility and penance.

ROSE: Symbolizes joy. It is seen on *Gaudete* Sunday in Advent and *Laetara* Sunday in Lent. *Gaudete* and *Laetara* are Latin words that mean rejoice. These Sundays anticipate the joy that is to come at Christmas and Easter.
