**HOLY THURSDAY: THE WASHING OF FEET:**

At the Last Supper, before instituting the Eucharist and entering into His Passion, Jesus washed his Disciples' feet. The washing of feet was considered a degrading act of service, fit for only the lowest servants. Jesus then told His Disciples, "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do." (John 13:14-15) Christ's act of washing feet was a call to serve one another in humility, putting others' needs ahead of our own comfort, convenience, or reputation. Popes have called themselves the "servant of the servants of God" to remind themselves that Christ "did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28) Let us pray for grace to follow Jesus by pouring out our own lives in loving service of others.

### Encountering Christ in Lent

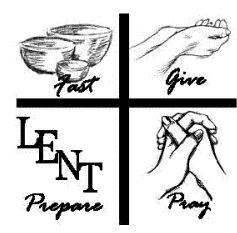
#### Encountering Christ in Prayer:

⇒ Tenebrae Service: **Friday, March 30 @ 7:30 p.m.**

The Spiritual Life Committee along with our parish youth group are working together to put on a Tenebrae Service for Good Friday. Tenebrae (Latin for shadows or darkness) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours that was celebrated in the evening during the Triduum and dates from the 7th or 8th century. The mood is somber, quiet and reflective. Rich in symbolism, the service of Tenebrae incorporates the use of light and darkness to evoke the spiritual reality recalled within the prayer.



Candles are lit and are extinguished one by one so that by the end, only one candle is left burning as we contemplate the temporary triumph of the prince of darkness over the Light of the World.

“**CARRY THE CROSS**” is a 12-mile Stations of the Cross hike sponsored by Wilderness Outreach for the men, fathers, and sons of the Columbus Diocese. A cross constructed of 3”X6” timber, approximately 10’ long with a 7’ cross beam is carried by the men on the journey with the Stations of the Cross prayed every mile or so. Men should bring a day pack with 2-3 liters of water, snacks, and rain gear if appropriate. During the hike, silent meditation on our Lord’s passion is encouraged. Praying the Rosary and other communal and traditional prayers are also encouraged.
