2nd Sunday of Advent symbolizes **PEACE** with the “Angel’s Candle” reminding us of the message of the angels: “Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.”

3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes **JOY** with the “Shepherd’s Candle” reminding us of the Joy of the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.

4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes **LOVE** with the “Bethlehem Candle” reminding us of Mary and Joseph’s journey to Bethlehem.
